

Corrugated player sets sights on 20% growth

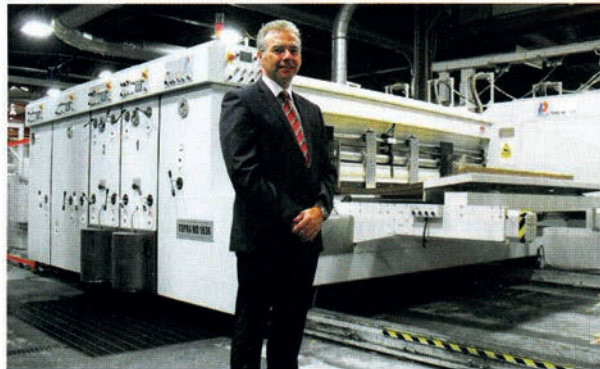

Corrugated Case Company is looking to grow its business by 20% after several kit investments and a warehouse expansion, which is planned for next year.

Managing director Mark Wilcockson said the Chesterfield business was going “from strength to strength” following more than £500,000 of investments in the last 12 months. In the next year his company will extend the footprint of the factory, doubling the size of warehousing.

“We have just installed a Dong Fang 3.8m flexo rotary die-cutter, an Autobox 2.8m short run box-maker and a Sodeme 3.2m stitcher gluer,” he said.

“These produce corrugated packaging for industries including kitchen, flat pack furniture

and windows.”

“We are in a period of evolution and looking for organic growth,” he said. “With the new equipment and new factory layout, we have at least another 20% of growth to achieve, taking us comfortably to

around £6m a year in sales.”

“Once we have moved all the warehousing into the new factory extension it will allow us a further 800m² of production space to add a further converting line or two,” said Wilcockson.
